

Bridge the Gap Programs



In-School Intervention

Students Served: 80

Specially trained teachers partner with teachers from Sausalito Marin City School District (SMCSD), providing support to elementary students who are below gradelevel in math and reading.

Extended Day

Students Served: 150

BTG, in partnership with SMCSD, offers a supportive, culturally enriching after-school program that includes academic assistance, enrichment activities, and socialemotional learning.



Evening Program

Students Served: 50

The evening program at Dr. MLK Jr. Academy provides students with warm dinners, engaging activities, and fun, pairing each with a dedicated volunteer for year-round support and care beyond classroom learning.



High School Program

Students Served: 100

Students benefit from personalized support in academics, extracurriculars, life skills, and college prep, including financial aid guidance, from advisors, teachers, and tutors, ensuring their all-around success.



College & Career

Students Served: 65

We support students into college and beyond with internships, leadership training, networking, and annual scholarships, fostering success for all BTG students.

Lea Mixon, BTG Alumna and Staff

Lea Mixon's transformative journey from a second-grade student to the Middle School Site Coordinator at Bridge the Gap (BTG) underscores the profound impact of mentorship and community support in shaping educational pathways. Diagnosed with dyslexia at a young age, Lea faced academic challenges that could have limited her future prospects. However, her engagement with BTG, particularly the guidance from her mentor, Terry, paved the way for her to overcome these obstacles. Terry's mentorship extended beyond academic support, exposing Lea to opportunities that nurtured her potential and ambition.

This unwavering support enabled Lea to pursue her college degree at Cal State Northridge, where she studied Communications and Africana Studies. In 2023, Lea returned to BTG as a staff member committed to the educational and personal development of middle school students at Dr. MLK Academy. Her return to BTG marked a full-circle moment, highlighting her dedication to empowering the next generation through education.

100% of the middle school students at BTG passed their courses, a testament to the program's effectiveness and Lea's impact as a mentor. Lea's journey exemplifies BTG's mission to provide comprehensive support to underserved students, ensuring their success from early education through to college and beyond.

Fatima's story: My journey from Senegal to Tam High School

Growing up in Senegal, I was surrounded by the richness of my country. But my Dad, envisioning a brighter future filled with education and opportunities, convinced me that America was the place for this dream to unfold. So, in 2021, still in the thick of the pandemic, I landed in the US, clutching onto memories of home, friends, and family, worried about how my life had been uprooted.

Facing a new country without the comfort of my native French, Wolof, or Arabic languages was daunting. My initial American schooling experience was online, a format alien to me, heightening my sense of isolation. Questions plagued me—would my accent be understood, would I be mocked?

Then came a pivotal moment. My brother, seeing me struggle, suggested I try Bridge the Gap. Hesitant at first, I took the leap. At Bridge the Gap, the staff welcomed me and I felt loved, valued and understood. Coming to Bridge the Gap transformed my experience in America. Louise, a tutor, became my mentor, nurturing my passion for filmmaking and storytelling through the "My Place, My Story" workshop.

Now, as a junior with a 3.8 GPA, fluent in four languages, with dreams of attending UCLA, I look back at the uncertain girl who landed in America. That girl has found her voice, and now is unafraid to share her story and her accent. Bridge the Gap isn't just a program; it has been the bridge to finding my solid and confident place in a new country.

High School & College Success Program

Navigating the complexities of college applications and financial aid processes is a critical service provided by Bridge the Gap, especially for families experiencing these challenges for the first time or in a language that is not their primary one. Chinna Williams, the College Success Program Manager, offers essential guidance to Bridge the Gap high school students and their families, significantly increasing access to college. Her role is pivotal in demystifying what can often seem like an insurmountable barrier to higher education, providing a much-needed support system for students and their families.

This tailored support has led to impressive achievements, such as a 100% completion rate of the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) among Bridge the Gap seniors during the 2022–2023 school year, surpassing both national and county averages. Completing the FAFSA is a vital step in accessing financial assistance for college, essential for enrollment, persistence and success in higher education and beyond.

This commitment to guiding students through the financial aid process underscores the organization's broader mission: empowering students to achieve their goals and <u>making their dreams of higher education a reality.</u>




