POSITION SUMMARY/OVERVIEW

Bridge the Gap (BTG) is a nonprofit founded in 1995 to provide much needed academic support for students furthest from opportunity. BTG provides a pathway to educational opportunity and post secondary success. BTG offers culturally competent, accessible, relevant and comprehensive academic and youth development enrichment both during and outside of the school day in a demanding yet nurturing environment. The High School Advisor works both during the school day and afterschool at area high schools. The schedule is 10 am to 6 pm, with occasional evening and weekend events. This position is focused at the various high schools in the Tamalpais Union High School District. The Advisor's primary role is to holistically support our high school students to remain on track towards high school graduation and viable post-secondary options. The role includes planning and delivery of workshops for students. The Advisor works closely with the other Advisor and other BTG program staff as well as the high school teachers, staff and administration. This job is in person at area high schools and the BTG office.
